Some winemakers prefer to use this method because their goal is a more fresh and fruity sparkling wine.

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## RIESLING

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The Riesling is considered as one of the most noble grape varieties for wine making. The Riesling vine likes to grow in cooler conditions and produces wines with a distinctive vibrant acidity, agile fruitiness and the ability to reflect the terroir. In addition because of its higher acidity it is suitable for long ageing process. The wines usually show fresh fruit flavors like lemon, white peach and green apple.

Lower in acid and even lower yielding; Viognier kept to itself in Southern France until some traveling winemakers took hold of some plantings and dispersed them to New World areas like Australia.

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## PINOT GRIGIO / PINOT GRIS

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In recent years, Pinot Grigio has placed itself at the top of the chart varieties. Although widespread, the spiritual home of this variety is still in northern Italy, especially in the vineyards of Friuli-Venezia Giulia and Alto Adige. Mostly the wines are mild to moderate in body, show subtle aromas of white fruit and a spicy character.

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## CORTESE

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A flinty, herbal grape also known as 'Cortese del Piemonte' or the high-quality 'Cortese di Gavi'. Gavi is both a town and a wine region in Piedmont. Wine produced in the town of Gavi can be labeled as 'Gavi di Gavi'.

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## VERDICCHIO

Its commonly landed by critics as being one of Italy's best white wine grape varieties and is found in vineyards across the country.

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## CÔTE DU RHÔNE BLENDS
